

Student Responsibilities and Rules of Student Conduct

Violation of the following rules of conduct may result in corrective action.

General Rules of Conduct

1. Students shall obey all rules and regulations of the school district as determined by the administration and board of directors.
2. Students shall submit to lawful supervisory and disciplinary authority of the district and school.
3. Students shall obey classroom and campus rules as developed by the principal and staff members. Campus rules shall further apply to adjacent properties and designated areas neighboring the school grounds.
4. Students shall submit to reasonable corrective action imposed by the district or its authorized employees.
5. The rules concerning student conduct shall apply at all school-related activities on or off campus. Student conduct rules shall apply at bus stops, adjacent properties and designated areas neighboring the school grounds.
6. Adult students shall observe rules of conduct applicable to all students.

Specific Rules of Conduct

1. Disabled students are subject to the same treatment under the rules governing student conduct, with the modifications indicated in the provisions for the discipline of handicapped Section 504 students and available from the Director of Special Services as non-handicapped students. (See P3100-8 for special education student discipline.)
2. Secondary students participating in interscholastic athletics are further subject to the Cedarcrest High School Co-Curricular Code available from the building administration.
3. Students shall:
 - a. Be regular in attendance, remain on school grounds from the time of arrival and attend regularly scheduled classes, unless officially excused.
 - (1) Absences due to illness or a health condition; the need to seek medical, dental or other health care services; family emergencies; religious observances shall be excused in accordance with school attendance procedures.
 - (2) An excused absence shall be verified by the parent or guardian in accordance with school attendance procedures.

- (3) The freedom to assemble shall be limited to designated places where no hazards to persons or property shall occur. Times will be designated such that classes or other school activities shall not be disrupted. An assembly shall not interfere with the educational process through slander, obscenity, and profanity or demean any race, religion, sex or ethnic group.
- b. Use, possess, trade, purchase, sell or distribute tobacco or tobacco-related products on school property.
- c. Perform acts of misrepresentation:
 - (1) Falsify parent's, guardian's or other person's authorization on any school document or in any communication with the school;
 - (2) Cheat, plagiarize, or turn in another person's papers, projects, computer-generated products, programs, etc., as one's own or enable misrepresentation to occur;
 - (3) Other acts of misrepresentation; verbal or written.
- d. Gamble (playing cards, dice or games of chance for money or other things of value).

Riverview School District reserves the right to refer to law enforcement authorities any acts of its students which may constitute a crime under any federal, state, county, or local law.
